MEMORANDUM FOR STAFF SERGEANT :

SUBJECT: Grant of Transactional Immunity and Order to Testify—U.S. v. \_\_\_\_\_

1. An investigation revealed you may have relevant information regarding offenses allegedly committed by Master Sergeant \_\_\_\_\_, Air Force.

The offenses in question involve rape and indecent assault.

2. By authority vested in me in my capacity as a general court-martial convening authority under Rules for Court-Martial 704(c)(2), Manual for Courts-Martial, United States, 2002, I hereby grant you transactional immunity and order you to answer any questions posed to you by investigators and counsel pertaining to, and to testify at any proceeding held pursuant to the Uniform Code of Military Justice (Title 10, United States Code, Sections 801, et seq.), concerning any offenses allegedly committed by the military member identified above.

3. Under this grant of immunity, you may not be prosecuted for offenses to which your testimony relates. Specifically, you may not be tried by court-martial for offenses under Article 125 (Sodomy), Article 134 (Adultery), Article 134 (Indecent Acts), and Article 107 (false statement) of the Uniform Code of Military Justice. Additionally, this grant of immunity is extended to prevent the taking of any adverse administrative action under AFI 36-3208, Section 5G, and is to include immunity from any other adverse administrative action to include letters of reprimand, admonishment, counseling, and action under Article 15, UCMJ, relating to the above-referenced offenses. However, this immunity does not bar the use of your testimony, or information derived from it, in prosecuting you for perjury or giving a false statement during any questions or testimony referenced in paragraph two, or otherwise failing to comply with this order to testify.
